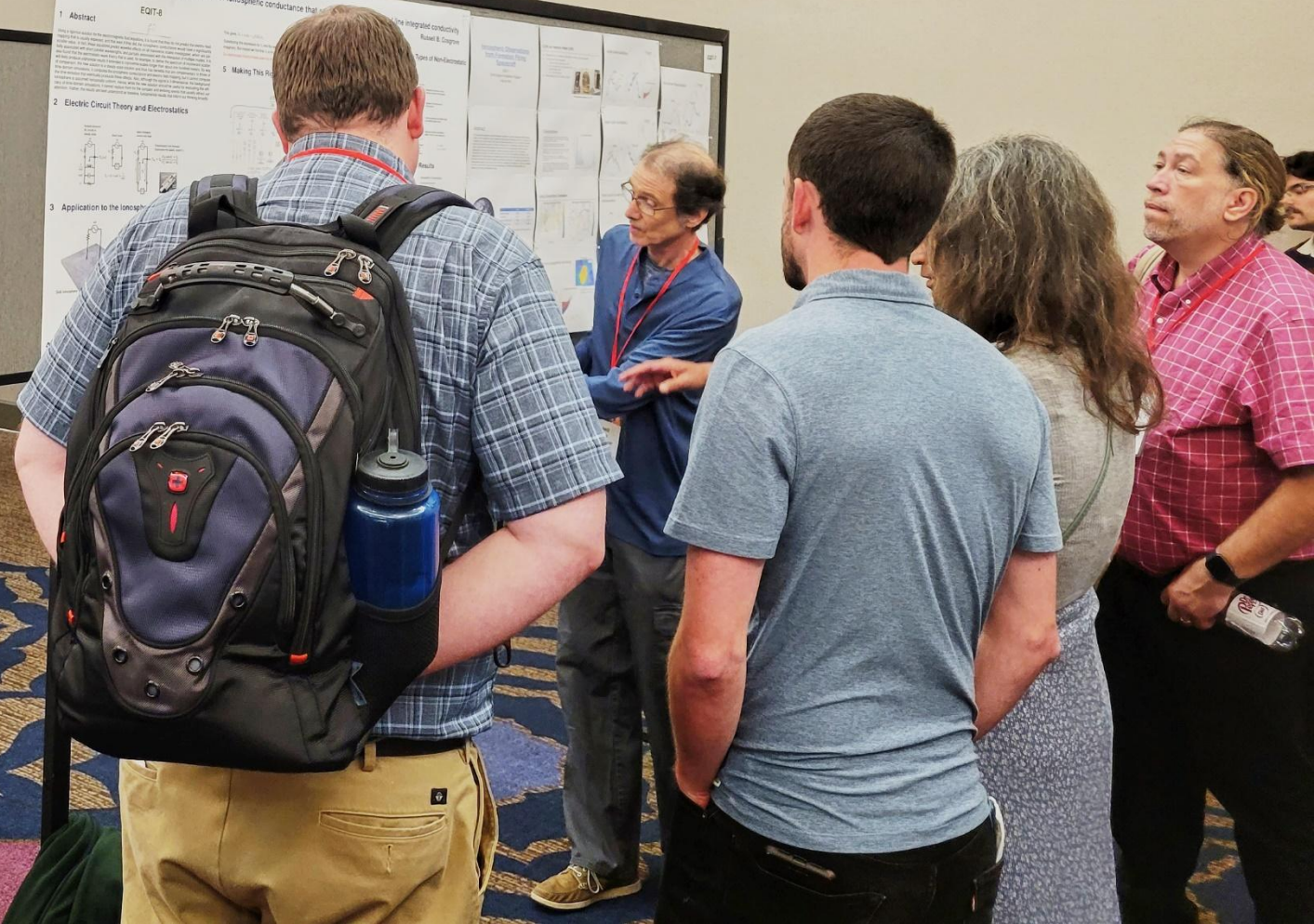
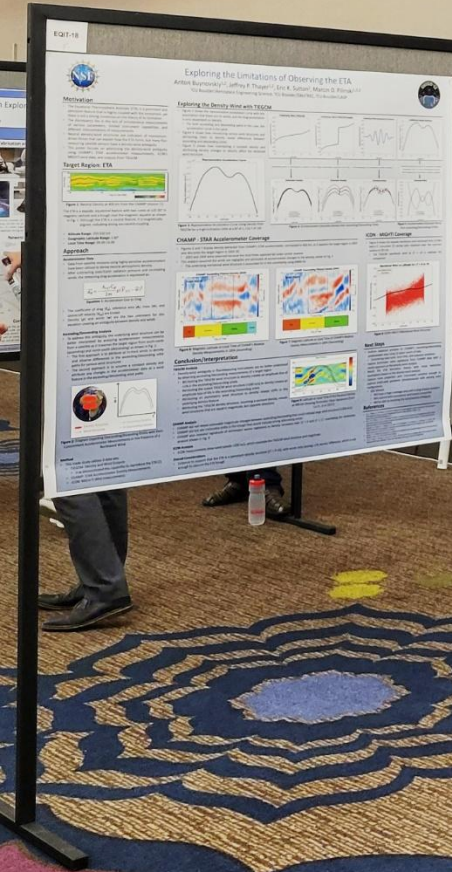


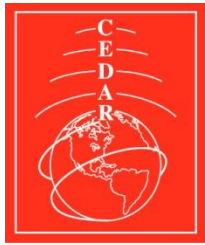
# CEDAR 2023 – Closing Remarks

Congratulations everyone for another fantastic CEDAR workshop!

This was the largest in-person CEDAR workshop ever, with:

- 420 total registered attendees
- 144 student attendees
- 107 students receiving financial support
- 1 other support grant
- 37 breakout workshop sessions
- 200 total posters
- 144 student posters: 200 US, 44 international, 113 in the competition

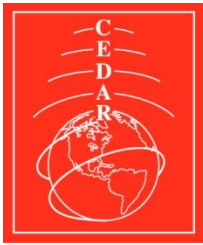

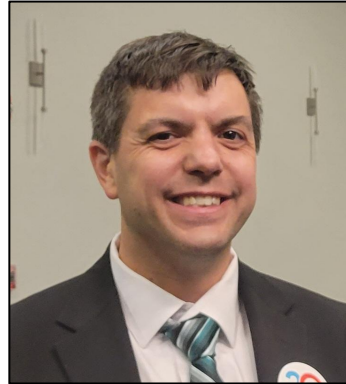

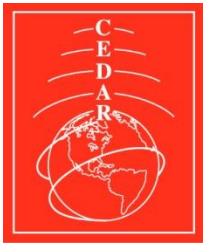

# Feedback

We are constantly soliciting comments and suggestions for improving the workshop. Feedback received so far includes:

- ❑ The venue here in San Diego was good.
- ❑ Science presentations were well received. However, a number of attendees were frustrated by seeing the same talk presented multiple times in different workshop sessions.
- ❑ DEI accommodations were good, but could be improved –
  - DEI sessions/activities were perceived to be too scattered.
  - Name tags should offer an option to include pronouns.
  - Consider adding a “students’ breakfast.”
  - Consider adding DEI “safe space” options.
  - Clarify to whom DEI concerns can be reported.
  - The code of conduct could be posted more prominently.

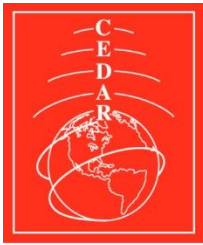

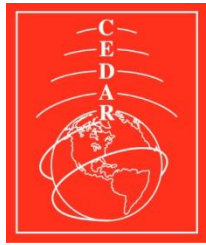


# Going Forward

- Further improving our support for DEI initiatives.

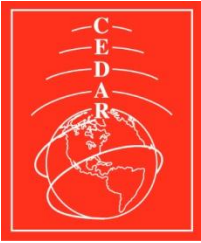
