








## Why network and be collaborative?

- It helps your research!
  - Few research papers have only one author.
- It helps your funding!
  - Learn about new funding opportunities
  - Learn how to write proposals
  - Create more powerful proposals
- It helps your mental health!
  - Many scientists have a shared experienced, and we can help each other get through rough times
  - Your network will help you know when you are doing too much, and help you refocus.
  - Your network will also help you know what you should expect as your progress in your career/life.
    - Particularly in CEDAR-GEM, which is so multi-generational.



## Tips on Networking

- Use your talents
  - Don't do things you do not want to.
- Get involved
  - Stay within your bandwidth
  - Do not worry about being too "junior" or "senior"
- Talk to others
